Samuel was ministering before the LORD




Hannah made him a little robe.

Unnamed prophet's message:

 v.29: Why do you [plural] kick at My sacrifice . . . and honor [singular] your sons above Me, by making yourselves [plural] fat with the choicest of every offering of My people Israel? Eli got fat on the food his sons stole (4:18).

The curse on Eli's family line:

- Disgrace to those who despise God (30)
- No strength to live to old age (31)
- No prosperity (32)
- No priestly service (33)
- Weeping & grieving (33)

The curse on Eli's family line:


- Violent deaths in their prime (33)
 Hophni and Phinehas to die violently on the same day (34)
 Begging for food and work from
- the faithful priest who will come (35-36)

The End of Eli's Priestly Line

 "So Solomon dismissed Abiathar from being priest to the LORD, in order to fulfill the word of the LORD, which He had spoken concerning the house of Eli in Shiloh" (1 Kings 2:27).

 Abiathar had a son (Jonathan), but he must not have become a priest (1 Kings 1:42).

Samuel was ministering to the LORD before Eli (3:1).



God spoke to Samuel.





Samuel told Eli the whole message from the Lord (3:18). Eli seemed resigned. The Lord confirmed Samuel as a prophet (3:20).

Final Thoughts:

- The Lord holds both parents & children responsible for their actions.
- It's possible to serve the Lord without knowing Him.
- Spiritual growth happens only after a personal encounter with God.
