The Philistines' Guilt Offering

- Represented the causes of their suffering
- Included five mice and five tumors to represent their five major cities & their rulers
- Made of gold—therefore, valuable & showing sacrifice in an attempt to appease God

The Philistines' Guilt Offering


- Was a plea for healing
- Showed submission to God and recognition of His power
- Just as Dagon, their god, bowed before the God of Israel, their suffering caused them to “bow” by returning His ark and pleading for Him to stop afflicting them.


The Philistines' Test

- Yoked two milk cows that had never pulled a cart
- Separated the cows from their calves
- Watched to see if God would make them move away from their calves and toward Israel
- Concluded that God was indeed the cause of their plague



The Ark's Travels






Samuel: Man of Prayer

- **Ps. 99:6** Moses and Aaron were among His priests, And Samuel was among those who called on His name; They called upon the LORD and He answered them.
- **Jer. 15:1** Then the LORD said to me, “Even if Moses and Samuel stood before Me, My mind would not be favorable toward this people.”

Part of Hannah's Prayer

- 1 Sam. 2:10 “Those who contend with the LORD will be shattered; Against them He will **thunder** in the heavens.”
- Ironically, Baal was associated with storms, thunder, & lightning. God shows **He** is in control.
