Ecclesiastes 8:1-3

- Who is like the wise man and who knows the interpretation of a matter? A man's wisdom illumines him and causes his stern face to beam.
- I say, "Keep the king's commandment for the sake of your oath to God."
- "Do not be in a hurry to leave him. Do not join in an evil matter, for he will do whatever he pleases."

Ecclesiastes 8:4-5

- Since the word of the king is authoritative, who will say to him, “What are you doing?”
- He who keeps a royal command experiences no trouble, for a wise heart knows the proper time and procedure.

Deuteronomy 13

12 The man who acts presumptuously [arrogantly] by not listening to the priest who stands there to serve the LORD your God, nor to the judge, that man shall die; thus you shall purge the evil from Israel.

13 Then all the people will hear and be afraid, and will not act presumptuously again.

3 For I was envious of the arrogant
As I saw the prosperity of the wicked.

16 When I pondered to understand
this, It was troublesome in my sight

21 Thus my heart was grieved, And I
was vexed in my mind.

22 I was so foolish and ignorant; I
was like a beast before You.

Psalm 73 (Asaph wrote)

17 Until I came into the sanctuary of God; Then I perceived their end.

26 My flesh and my heart may fail, But God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever.

27 For, behold, those who are far from You will perish; You have destroyed all those who are unfaithful to You.
