

PROVERBS 18:21

- The tongue has the power of life and death, and those who love to talk will have to eat their own words (NOG).
- Words kill, words give life; they're either poison or fruit—you choose (MSG).

METONYMY

- Tongue = words
- Metonymy = substituting a word for a closely related concept
- “I’m studying Shakespeare”
(for the plays of the author)

POWER OF WORDS

- God spoke the universe into existence.
- Jesus is the Word made flesh (John 1:14).
- The Bible is God's Word.
- The word is the gospel (1 Peter 1:23-25, ESV).

POWER OF WORDS

- When Jesus returns to judge the earth at His Second Coming, He will speak and defeat His enemies.

RESULTS OF GOSSIP

- Contention (discord, conflict)
- Ruined reputations
- Harm to the hearer
- Strife
- Ruined Friendships

RESPONSE TO GOSSIP

- Avoid gossips.
- Don't listen to them.
- Recognize them as sinners who will face God's wrath.
- Don't participate in or approve of gossip.

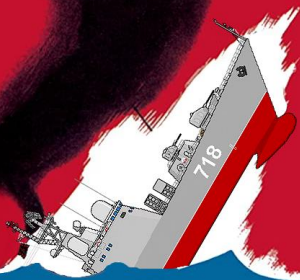


- Insincere praise

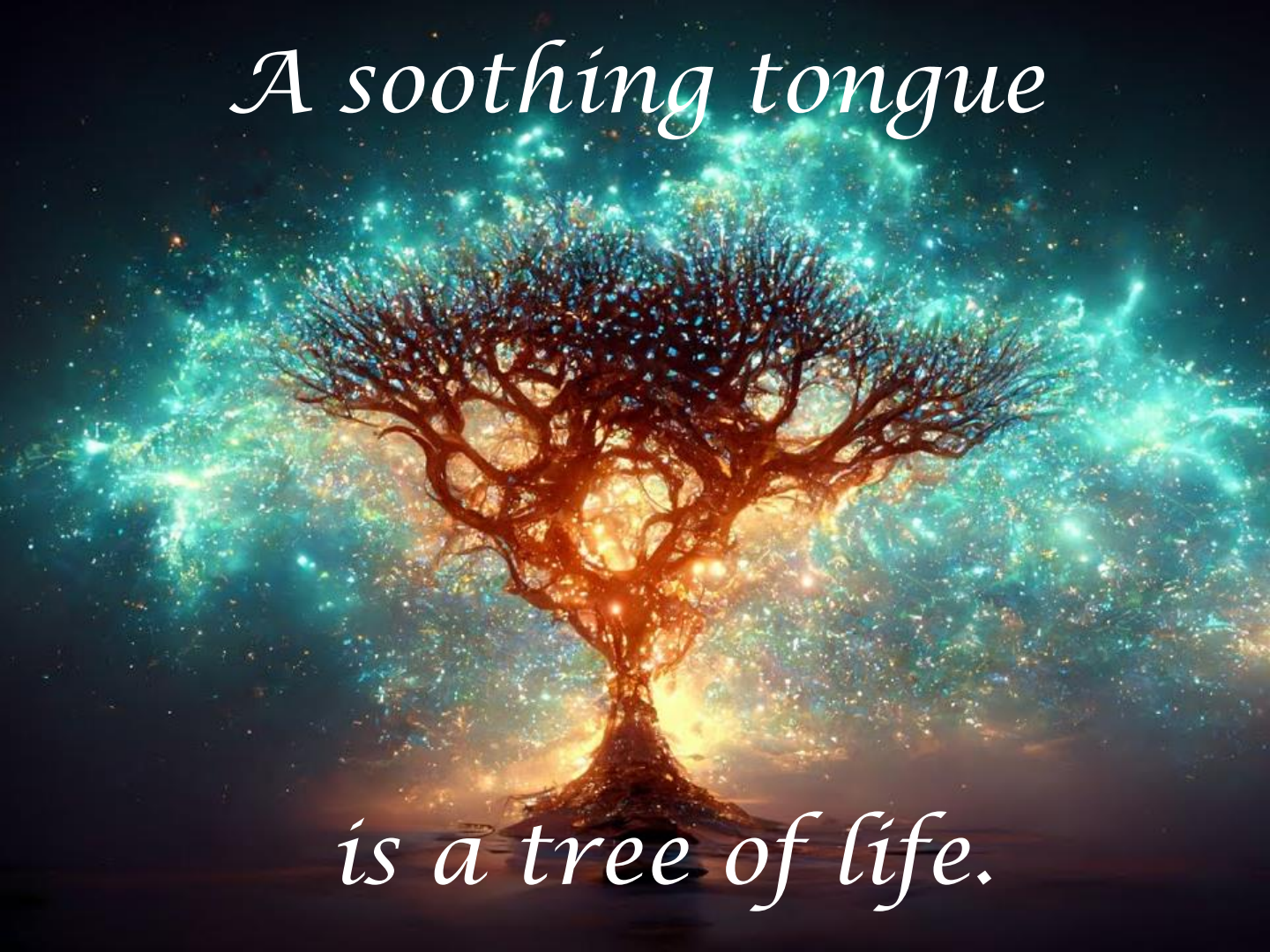

- **Calm or deflect anger**
- **Make knowledge attractive**
- **Delight the soul**
- **Heal inner hurts**

How can I control my tongue?

- Pray for God's help to be willing & able (Php. 2:13; Ps.141:3; Ps. 19:14; Col. 4:6)
- Have an accountability partner.
