


# PROVERBS, LESSON 11: THE TONGUE



## **PROVERBS 18:21**

- The tongue has the power of life and death, and those who love to talk will have to eat their own words (NOG).
- Words kill, words give life; they're either poison or fruit—you choose (MSG).

## **METONYMY**

- Tongue = words
- Metonymy = substituting a word for a closely related concept
- "I'm studying Shakespeare" (for the plays of the author)



## **POWER OF WORDS**

- God <u>spoke</u> the universe into existence.
- Jesus is the <u>Word</u> made flesh (John 1:14).
- The Bible is God's Word.
- The word is the gospel (1 Peter 1:23-25, ESV).

#### POWER OF WORDS

- When Jesus returns to judge the earth at His Second Coming, He will <u>speak</u> and defeat His enemies.
- From His mouth comes a sharp sword, so that with it He may strike down the nations (Rev. 19:15).

#### RESULTS OF GOSSIP


- Contention (discord, conflict)
- Ruined reputations
- Harm to the hearer
- Strife
- Ruined Friendships

## **RESPONSE TO GOSSIP**

- Avoid gossips.
- Don't listen to them.
- Recognize them as sinners who will face God's wrath.
- Don't participate in or approve of gossip.

#### **FLATTERY**


- Insincere praise
- Often excessive
- Manipulative
- Selfish
- Unkind
- Destructive

## **PROVERBS 18:20**

- "With the fruit of a man's mouth his stomach will be satisfied; He will be satisfied with the product of his lips."
- Too often a person is in love with the sound of his own voice. Beware!

## **CONTROL YOUR TONGUE**

- Less likely to embarrass self
- Less likely to hurt others
- Less likely to gossip
- More likely to look wise
- Less likely to get into trouble









# How can I control my tongue?

- Know Jesus personally so that the Holy Spirit can give me self-control.
- Pray for God's help to be willing & able (Php. 2:13; Ps.141:3; Ps. 19:14; Col. 4:6)
- Have an accountability partner.

God is all powerful, yet He doesn't force Himself on us.

He can & will help us to control our tongues—if we will allow Him to.
