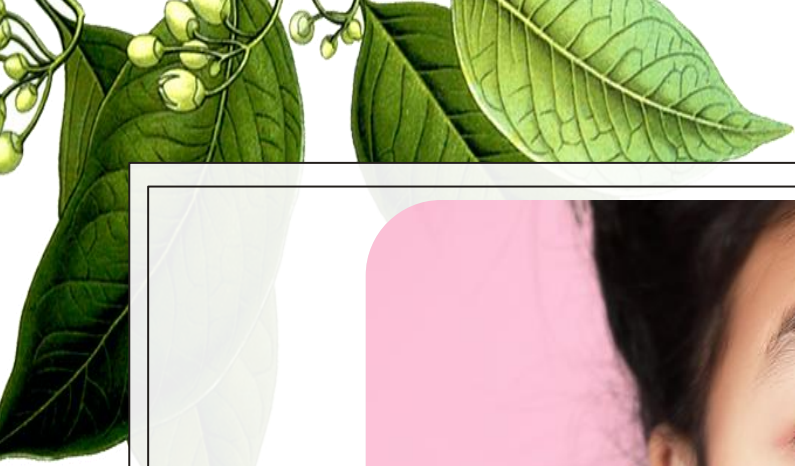

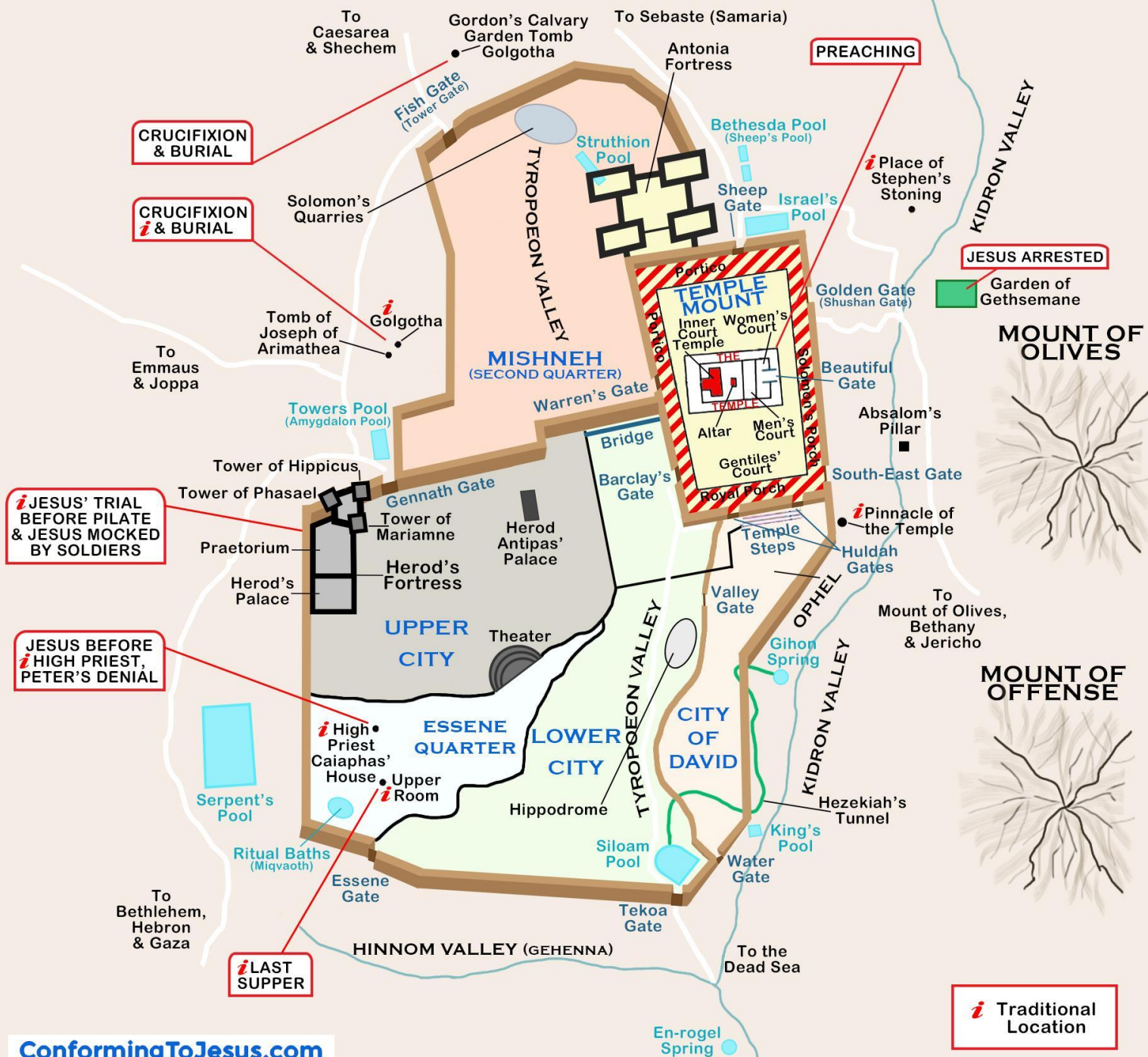

Traditional Location

The Reasons for Jesus' Words To His Disciples

1. To keep them from stumbling (16:1)
2. To prepare them for the future (16:2)
3. To explain why people behave the way they do and why believers must expect hatred and rejection (16:3)
4. To give them words to remember when He is no longer with them (16:4-5)

The Reasons for Jesus' Words To His Disciples

5. To minister to them in their sorrow (16:6-33)

- a. He promises them the Holy Spirit (16:7-15).
 - 1) Advantage: not limited by location (7)
 - 2) Ministry: conviction of sin, righteousness, & judgment (16:8-11)
 - 3) Ministry: guiding you into all truth & disclosing the future (16:13)

The Reasons for Jesus' Words To His Disciples

5. To minister to them in their sorrow (16:6-33)
 - a. He promises them the Holy Spirit (16:7-15).
 - 4) Ministry: Glorifying Christ (16:14-15)
 - b. He tells them to expect temporary sorrow (16:16-20).
 - c. He tells them to expect permanent joy (16:20-22).

The Reasons for Jesus' Words To His Disciples

5. To minister to them in their sorrow (16:6-33)
 - d. He tells them that answered prayer will make their joy complete (16:23-24).
 - e. He says that the Father loves them & will answer their prayers without Jesus' intercession, purely because He loves them (16:26-27). Jesus is returning to the Father (16:28).

The Reasons for Jesus' Words To His Disciples

5. To minister to them in their sorrow (16:6-33)
 - f. He says that their belief is imperfect and will cause them to disappoint Jesus, but the Father will make up for their lack (16:31-32).
6. To give them peace in Him—because trouble awaits them in the world (16:33). But take courage! He has overcome the world!

Praying in Jesus' Name

1. I have a relationship to the Father (John 8:42-44; 1:12; 14:6).
2. My behavior and lifestyle are pleasing to God (1 John 3:22).
3. I have confessed and renounced known sin (Psalm 66:18-19; Isaiah 1:15-17; 1 Peter 3:12).

Praying in Jesus' Name

4. My motives are pure (Mat. 6:5; James 4:3).
5. I abide in Christ and His words abide in me (John 15:7).
6. I ask in genuine faith (Mat. 21:22).
7. I ask in His will (1 John 5:14).

Chapter 17

Jesus' High Priestly Prayer

- 17:1-5—Prayer concerning Himself—reporting back to the Father
- 17:6-19—Prayer for His disciples
- 17:20-26—Prayer for future believers

Glorify God (17:1)

- To glorify God is to honor Him with praise or worship.
- Name His magnificent attributes and thank Him.
- Direct our praise, adoration, thanksgiving, and worship to Him (1 Chronicles 16:8-36).

The Progression (17:8)

- Jesus GAVE God's Word to them.
- They RECEIVED it.
- They UNDERSTOOD it.
- They BELIEVED.

J—have joy (17:13)

E—be protected from evil (17:15)

S—be sanctified (17:17)

U—have unity (17:21)

S—see His glory (17:24)
