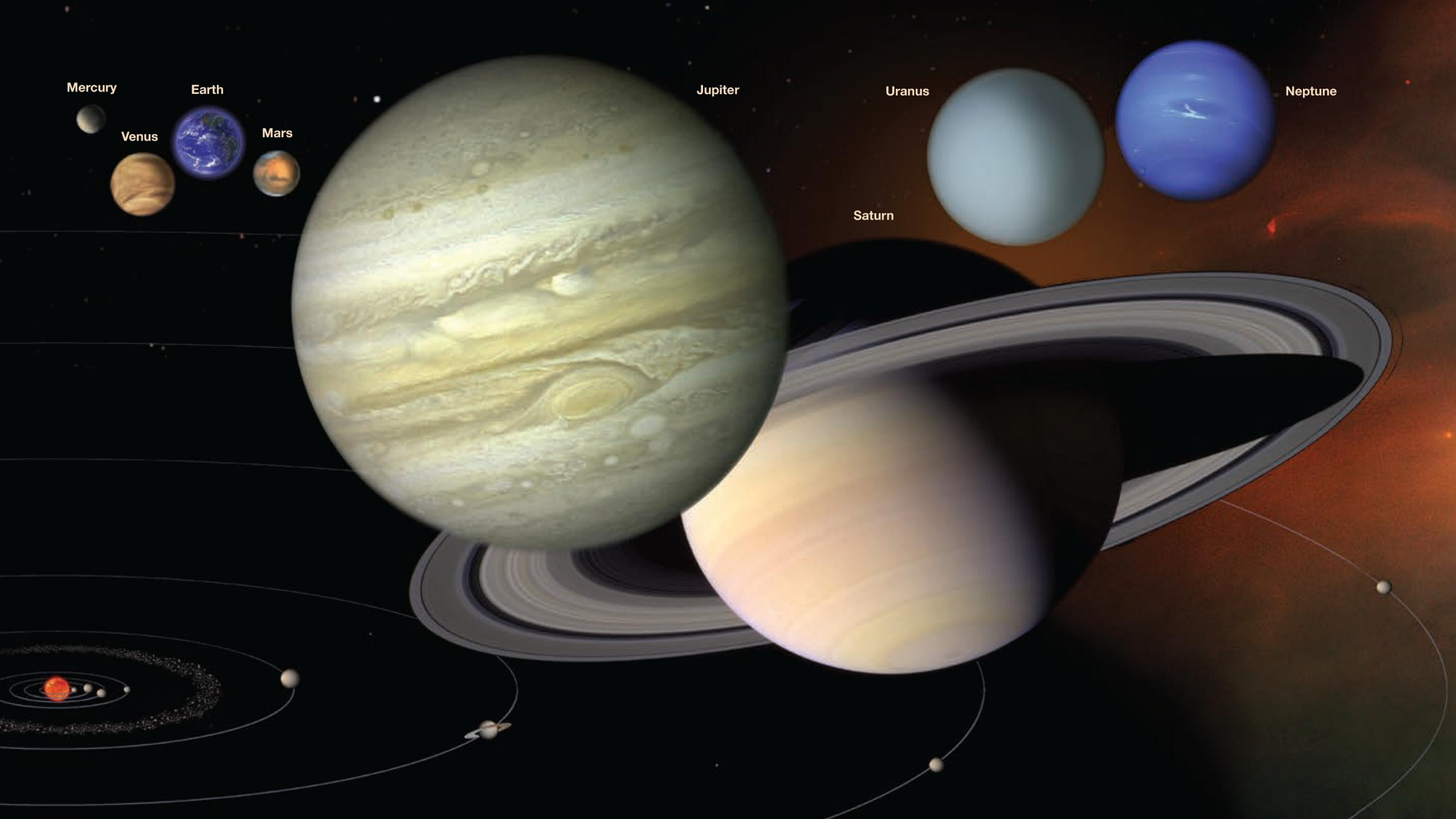

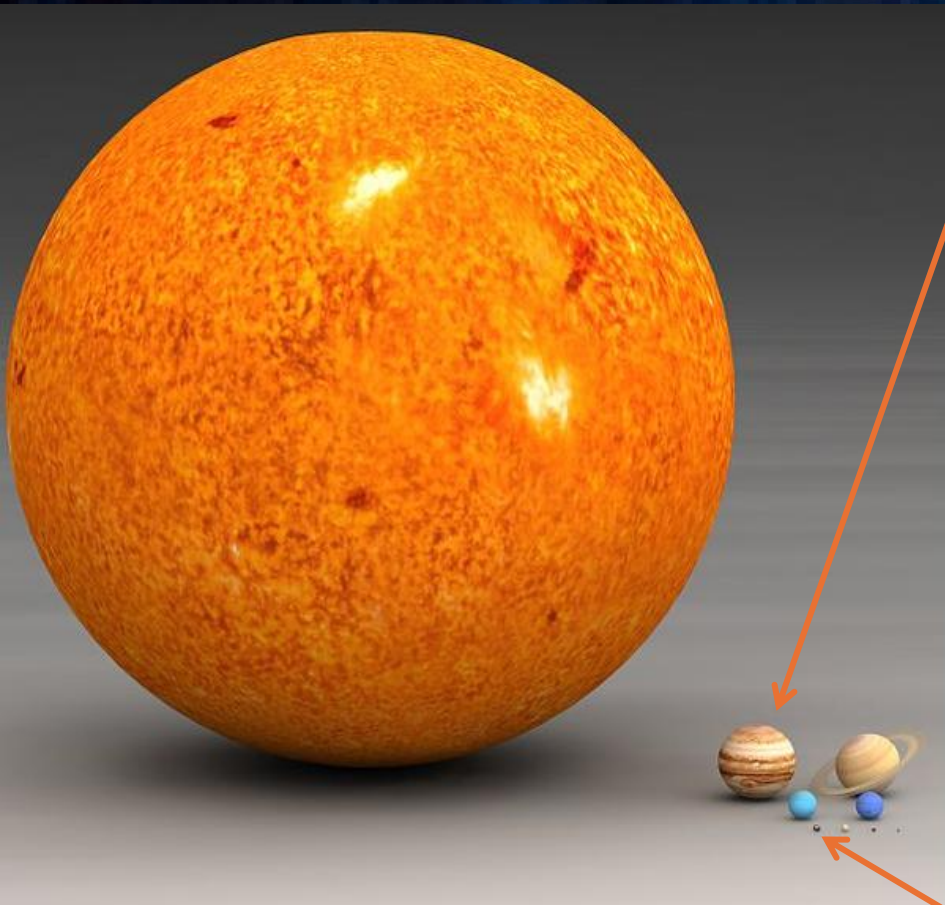

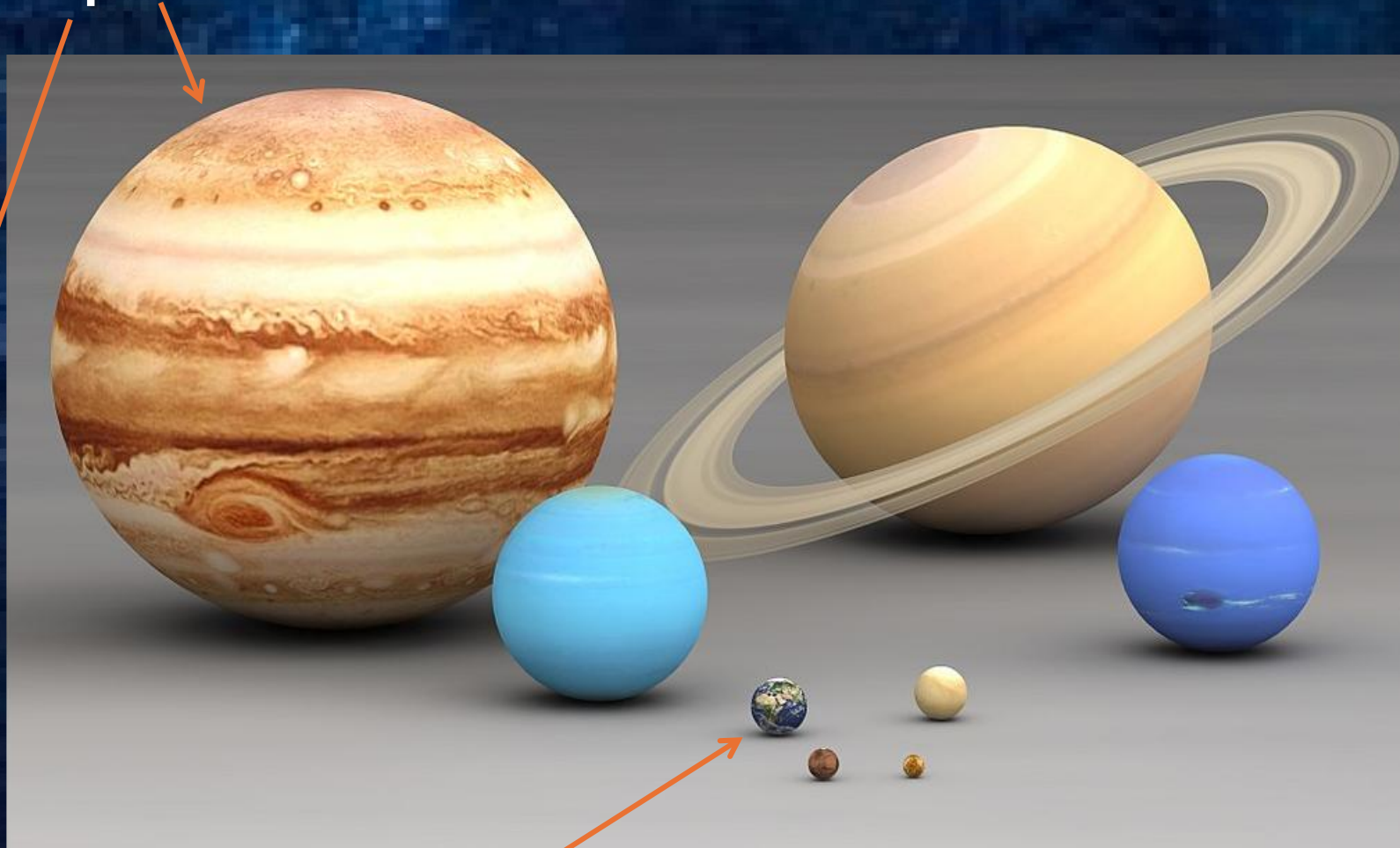

- ⁵ Yet you have made him a little lower than the heavenly beings and crowned him with glory and honor.

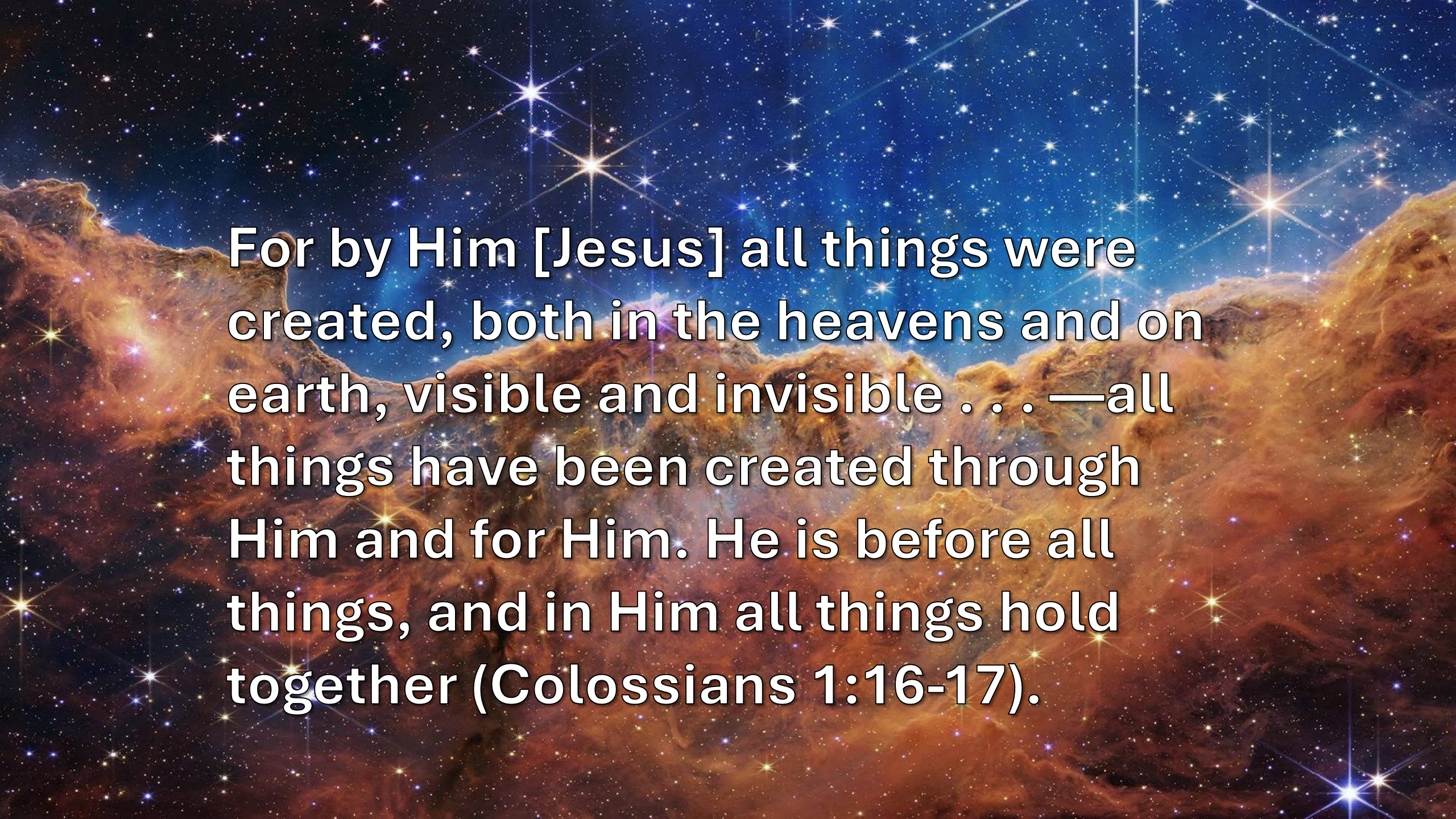

Jesus Cites Moses as the Author

- Now He said to them, “These are My words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things which are written about Me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled” (Luke 24:44).

Genesis as History, not Myth

- Luke 3:38 traces Jesus' biological history to Adam.
- Romans 5:12 & 14 tells us that through one man (Adam) sin entered the world.
- 1 John 3:12 refers to Cain and his brother (Abel) as real people.
- Hebrews 11 lists Abel, Enoch, and Noah as heroes of faith & examples to us.

Genesis as History, not Myth (Jesus' Words)

- Matthew 19:8 refers to how marriage was in the beginning (Gen. 2).
- Matthew 8:11 speaks of Abraham, Isaac, & Jacob (Gen. 12 ff).
- Luke 17:26-27 compares future judgment to the days of Noah & the Flood (Gen. 6-8).
- Luke 17:28-29 speaks of Lot & what happened at Sodom (Gen. 19-20).

Romans 1:18-20

- 18 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth.
- 19 For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them.
- 20 For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So they are without excuse.

Romans 1:21-22

- 21 For even though they knew God, they did not honor Him as God or give thanks, but they became futile in their speculations, and their foolish heart was darkened.
- 22 Professing to be wise, they became fools.

The Golden Rule of Biblical Interpretation

- When the plain sense of Scripture makes common sense, seek no other sense, lest it result in nonsense (Dr. David L. Cooper).
- Don't use human reasoning to twist Scripture into meaning what you want it to mean.
- Submit to the authority of God's Word.
