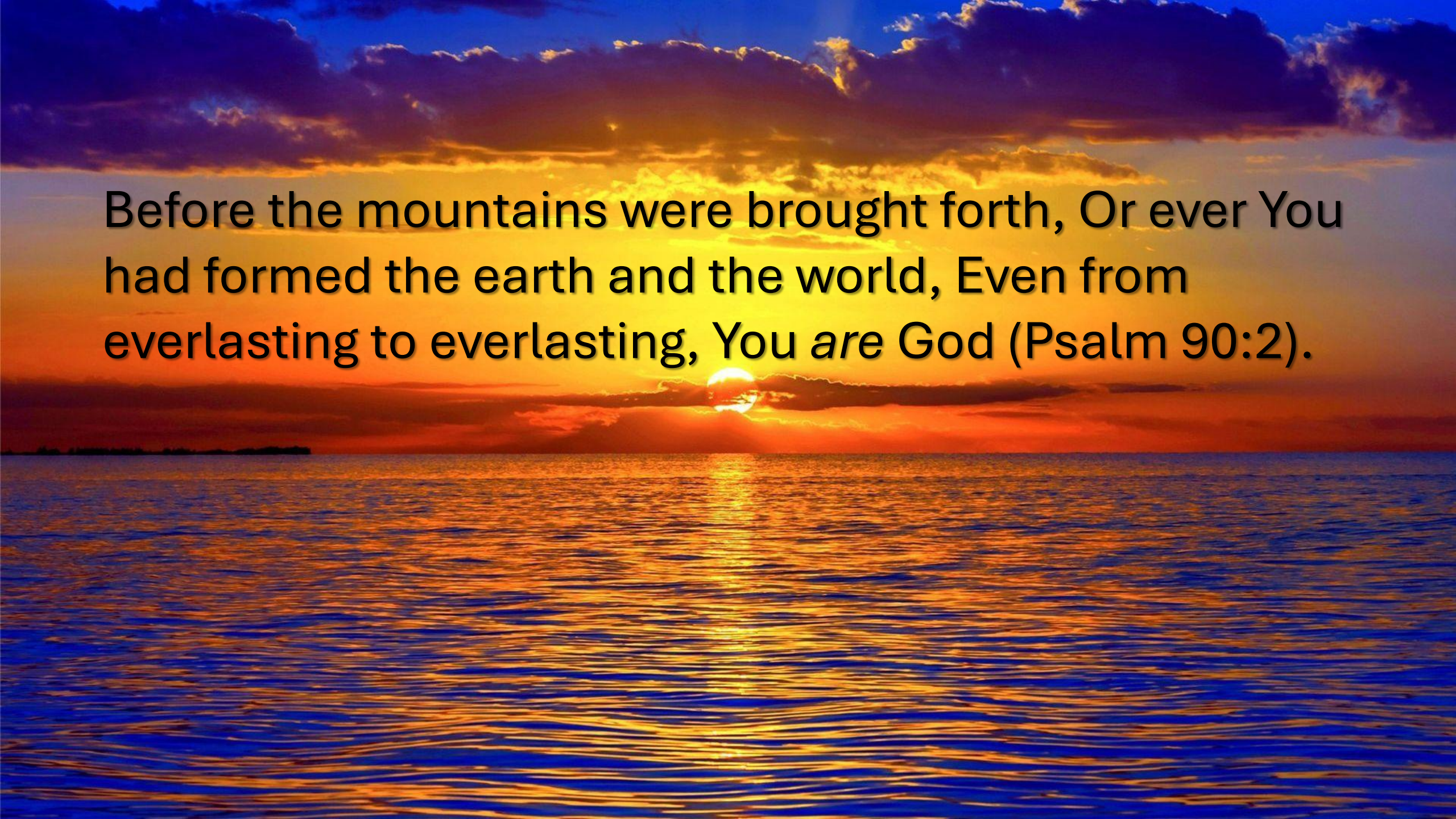

God: The Source of Light in the Beginning & the End

- Isaiah 60:19 tells us that in the future when Jesus rules on the earth, “No longer will you have the sun for light by day, Nor for brightness will the moon give you light; But you will have the LORD for an everlasting light, And your God for your glory.”

God: The Source of Light in the Beginning & the End

- Revelation 22:5 says, “And there will no longer be any night; and they will not have need of the light of a lamp nor the light of the sun, because the Lord God will illumine them; and they will reign forever and ever.”

What is a “day”? (Hebrew, *yom*)

1. A specific 24-hour day (Gen 8:14—“on the 27th DAY of the month”)
2. A 12-hour period of daylight (Gen 1:14—“to separate the DAY from the night”)
3. A longer, indeterminate period (Gen 2:4—“In the DAY [time] that the Lord made heaven & earth”)

The Days of Genesis 1 as 24-Hour Days

1. God defines *day* (Hebrew, *yom*) for us:
evening + morning = day (cf. Dan. 8:14)
2. Genesis uses time words with usual meanings:
day (1:8), year (1:14), season (1:14).
3. “Outside of Genesis 1, *yom* is used with a number 359 times, and each time it means an ordinary day” (Ken Ham 93).

The Days of Genesis 1 as 24-Hour Days

4. “For in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day; therefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day and made it holy” (Exodus 20:11).
5. Plants were created on Day 3. The sun was created on Day 4. If Day 3 were thousands of years long, all the plants would have died.

The Days of Genesis 1 as 24-Hour Days

6. Adam lived 930 years (Genesis 5:5), so we know the 6th day of creation could not have been thousands of years long.

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7. As we see in Gen. 1:11-12, 20-21, God created plants, birds, and water creatures mature and able to reproduce. They didn't require years of evolution to develop.





Genesis 1:21

So God created the large sea-creatures and every living creature that moves and swarms in the water, according to their kinds. He also created every winged creature according to its kind. And God saw that it was good.
